NWV HABITAT. 28 YEARS. HUNDREDS OF LIVES CHANGED.

Over the last 28 years NWV Habitat has strived to improve the lives of hardworking people, one family, neighborhood, and community at a time. Through responsible homeownership, NWV Habitat provides financial stability to families so they can better provide for the future of their children. Getting out of poverty housing and into a permanent home significantly increases a family's chance of success. Not only is the stability of owning a home beneficial to the family financially, but it also better the lives of children. A 2001 Harvard University study showed that, because of their stable home environment, children of homeowners display better behavior and higher cognitive test scores than children of renters. We are providing stability one family at a time through our new home construction, and our repairs program that keeps existing homeowners in their home.

THE PROBLEM

There are more than 6,600 families in our service area who are at or below 60% of median area income and would qualify for a Habitat home or for our ReHabitat repairs program. Poverty housing is an ongoing issue in our communities.

OUR SOLUTION

Our mission is to seek to put God's love into action, by bringing people together to build homes, communities and hope. We put our mission to work through new home builds, homeowner home repairs, homeowner education, & offering discounted building materials at our ReStore's.

- Finished and dedicated two homes in Gervais with the Snegirev and Cruz-Bautista families.
- Started construction on our affiliate's 42nd home.
- Increased ReStore sales by 25%.
- Completed 5 ReHabitat home repairs projects.
- Started an exciting Family Education program, serving 62 people.
- 273 people logged over 6,300 volunteer hours in 2014.
- Our ReStore's kept 578 tons of materials out of local landfills.

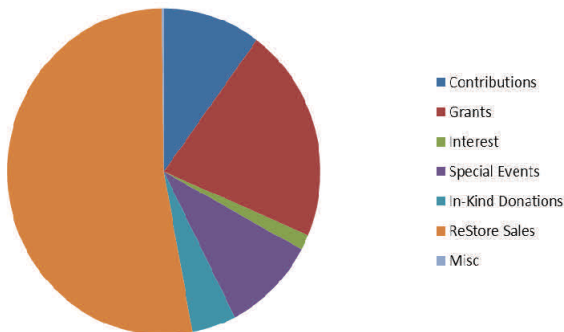

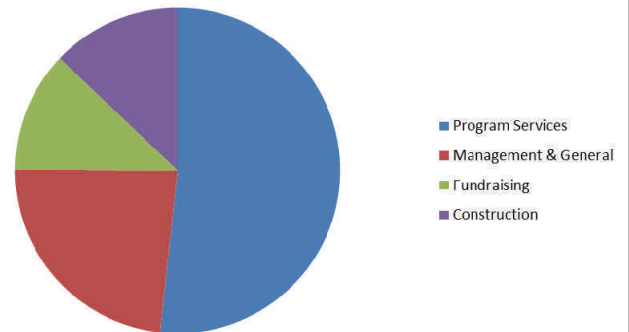
